 the Judicial and Legal Reform Strategy for 2019-2023 envisages the creation of an
 e-justice platform, which is a digital resource that will enable to be digitized
 proceedings in civil cases.
- 2. How is it stored and for how long? This is currently in the design stage, that's why it has not been clarified yet.

- 3. Who has access to the digital data in your jurisdiction? It is is envisaged by the above-mentioned Legal Reform Strategy, that all participants in the proceedings have the opportunity to perform their functions electronically and have access to the digital data.
- 4. Are there digital data protection rules in place in your jurisdiction? **Currently this is** also in the design stage.
