JANZ holds a very special place in our hearts and constitution for Pacific judges, and so I reached out to their Chief Justice with our kind thoughts and support.

I lived in Tonga, at Haatafu, around 2008 while assisting in the devolution of the monarchy into a democracy. The scale of the disaster can be seen from the photographs below.

These early days of rapid disaster relief will drift into the longer and more difficult task of rebuilding homes and communities and infrastructure. JANZ plans to work with the Pacific Lawyers Association to provide long-term support to the judges, lawyers, and law students of Tonga. We also encourage our regional and international association to assist. I would very much appreciate a message of support from both the IAJ and ANAO. As communication with Tonga is so poor at present may I suggest you send any email to the Chief Justice through me and I will ensure its delivery.
